Several people started skiing at 5 PM on the Twilight lift ticket and skied until past 10 PM (could have skied until midnight). On December 20, we had 33 participants from various clubs of the Crescent Ski Council, including W-SSOC's Ken Lumsden, Wes Snyder and George Wunker. It was a mild evening

with soft snow conditions that soon became rutted on the practice course. Ja reset the course and it helped! On January 3, it was a beautiful, clear, windless night with temperatures around 11 deg F. W-SSOC participants included Ken Lumsden, Wes Snyder, Vance Parker and George Wunker.

### Report from Sat.-Sun., Dec. 21-22, 2013 **First Race of the Regular Season, Appalachian Mountain**

We raced very well at Appalachian on Saturday, December 21, 2013. First off, as usual, we met our First and Second Directives and we had fun and raced safely!! Div 2 (which raced first) had decent conditions and weather, but fog began rolling in at the end of the Div 2 race and it was pea soup fog, with intermittent rain, during the Div 1 race. The forecast was for more, but an initial vote of the club Racing Team Directors was unanimous to attempt to hold Sunday's races. This was later overturned upon new information. So, we did not race on Sunday. Several of us who were still in the Blowing Rock/Boone/Sugar Mtn area on Sunday reported, sure enough, there was plenty of rain. We are not sure that the feared thunderstorms/lightning materialized.

Congratulations to both of our aspiring qualifiers who got qualified: **Caitlin Penry** (re-qualifying due to not racing during her freshman and sophomore years at UNC-Chapel Hill) and **Sophie Speckmann** (new qualifier). Qualifiers results do not count toward Individual or Team Points. Also back racing after a gap in participation were **Cathie Mulgrew** and **Connor Hearn**. Cathie re-qualified at the recent CSC Steamboat'13 Race Camp and Connor only missed last season, so both were eligible to race and their points counted toward Individual Points and Team Points.

In the points department, Wiley Speckmann led us with a perfect 20 points as he scored 10 points for each of two first-place runs for the day. In the Eastern Region, we scored 19 of maximum possible 20 Team Points on the first run, as our 6.09 Team Average and 2nd place 19 points edged Raleigh's 6.08 and third place 18 points. On the second run, we were solidly in first with 7.18 Team Average and 20 Team Points. Our combined 39 points



matched Greensboro's, but they edged us on the tie-breaker with Combined Team Average Points 13.79 vs. our 13.27.

At the Awards, all first place finishers received Swany gloves; second place received a Not Wax Ski Conditioning kit; third place received a (one of a variety of) knit cap. Several of our racers won door prizes, notably lift tickets at Taos by Cathie Mulgrew. George Wunker's name was drawn for a door prize but he was not present to win.

Div 1, Flight 4—Cathie Mulgrew—6th 5 pts + 4th 7 pts = 6th overall on tie-breaker and 12 points

Div 1, Flight 6—Eddie Apple-----6th 5 pts + 4th 7 pts = 4th overall and 12 points

Div 1, Flight 7—Wiley Speckmann (age 11)—1st 10 pts + 1st 10 pts = 1st overall and 20 points

Div 1, Flight 21—Caitlin Penry RE-qualified with hcp 32.9 (equivalent to top of Flight 5 in this race)

Div 2, Flight 11—Ken Lumsden-----2nd 9 pts + 1st 10 pts = 1st overall and 19 points

Div 2, Flight 11—Thomas Carroll (age 14)—8th 0 pts (DQ) + 8th 0 pts (DQ due to problem with binding) = 8th overall and 0 points

Div 2, Flight 13—Dena Carroll----2nd 9 pts + 3rd 8 pts = 2nd overall and 17 points

Div 2, Flight 16—George Wunker—3rd 8 pts + 2nd 9 pts = 2nd overall and 17 points

Div 2, Flight 16--Connor Hearn (age 7)---3rd 8 pts + 8th 0 pts (DQ) = 8th overall and 8 points

Div 2, Flight 22—Sophie Speckmann (age 8)—QUALIFIED with hcp 85.5 (equivalent to Flight 16 in this race)

**Report from Sat.-Sun., Jan. 4-5, 2014**

## **Second Race of the Regular Season, Sugar Mountain**

Our team took it on the chin at the CSC Races #2, Sugar Mtn, 1.5-6.2014. Everyone except Thomas Carroll, that is. On Saturday, we tied for 5th (last) with Catawba Valley; on Sunday, we placed 5th, outright, ahead of Catawba Valley. Overall, we are in fourth place in the Eastern Region with 102 points, behind Raleigh's 114, Greensboro's 112 and Charlotte's 110. We are a mathematical long shot to win the Regular Season Points Championship at this point, but it is not totally impossible. It would help our cause if we were to place first on both days of the remaining three races and if Greater Charleston and Catawba Valley were to place second/third. So, let's set our sights for the top! Or, at least near the top: remember, if everyone finishes 4th or better in his or her flights, we will win!

Thomas scored a perfect four first place finishes for the maximum weekend total of 40 points in his four runs in Flight 11 of Division 2. He improved his handicap enough (now 38.2) that he is likely to race in Division 1 for the first time at the upcoming races at Cataloochee. Thomas' 40 points also leap-frogged him into second place, behind his Mom, Dena, in the Team Points Rank. He would be far ahead in first place were it not for his two DQs on Race #1 at Appalachian (recall that there were only two runs in Race #1 because Sunday's races got cancelled due to rain).

Carol Santos, newly qualified from the CSC Steamboat'13 Race Camp, raced in her first regular races. Her new handicap of 79.15 will put her somewhere around Flights 16-18 in Division 2 of her next race.

Lynn Furner qualified in Flight 21 on Saturday at Sugar with a new handicap of 61.52. Lynn is a former Flight 4-level racer who is back racing after two years off. He is primed for a meteoric rise through the ranks because his 61.52 handicap from Sugar will put him somewhere in the middle of Division 2 when he races next. It will be a shock for those racers to have a racer of Lynn's caliber in their midst!

Linda Ortiz and Vance Parker were both registered to race, but came down with illnesses and did not race either day.

We experienced a wide range of weather conditions in this race weekend of racing. It was 11 deg and calm with decent course conditions at Appalachian for the Friday night practice.

Saturday morning, at Sugar, it was 13 deg F and overcast. Course conditions were very icy on the Div 1 course (we had 5 DQs!). Conditions on the rest of the mountain were boilerplate icy patches of the kind not seen in years interspersed with nice new machine-made snow. Combined with big crowds on Saturday, most racers skied very little after the races.

Sunday was another story. Temperatures warmed to the upper 30s in the AM, and 40s after the races. It drizzled a little toward the end of the races and was a little foggy, but, overall, course conditions were much better. Slope conditions after the races were vastly improved. Crowds were also almost non-existent, so it was possible to ski top-to-bottom non-stop! Many racers got in some good skiing after the races.

### **Report from Thursday, January 9, 2014 Day Ski Trip, Sugar Mountain, NC**

Well, this event started out great as we arrived at the slopes and were greeted by excellent snow conditions, mild temperatures and almost no other people. But, it all soon went "downhill". Pat Lumsden, skiing last down Big Birch on the very first run of the day (and her personal first of the season), skied from some nicely groomed snow into a patch of ungroomed machine-made snow. The change in texture and stickiness suddenly slowed her skis, but not Pat, and she went tumbling. What we thought was a bad sprain, turned out, after X-rays the next day, to be a non-dislocated fracture of her left fibula (small leg bone), just above the ankle. At press time, Pat just learned that surgery will be required to tighten the space between ends of the tibia and fibula (the gap where the foot bone (talus) fits. Pat received excellent care in the hands of the Sugar Mountain Ski Patrol. Our

friend and Crescent Ski Council Racing Chair, Ron Scott, was manning the base station that morning. Between him and Patroller Chris Harmon, Pat was able to rest comfortably while the rest of us enjoyed an otherwise really nice day of skiing at Sugar Mtn. Participants, in addition to Pat, included Carl Karpinski, Alex Karpinski, Kathy Furr, Phyllis Hudspeth, Ken Lumsden, Vance Parker and George Wunker.

### **Report from Tuesday, January 14, 2014 Tuesday Night at the Movies**

Tammy Cooper, Ken & Kathy Furr, Ken Lumsden and Randy Reavis participated in this Movie Night. We almost went to see *The Book Thief*.
