W-SSOC Racing Team Member, Wes Snyder, Finishes 3rd, overall, in Masters Races at Okemo, VT, March 16-22, 2014

Marty Reiter (GSOC), Bobby Roland (Asheville Ski Club) and I (Wes Snyder) competed with 240 other racers from all over the nation in the 2014 Phillips 66 U.S. Masters National Championships at Okemo Mountain Ski Resort, Vermont. There were 7 different age classes (ages 25 to 90 were there). I was in class 3.

The downhill was absolutely amazing with a perfect course set that was not too challenging but incredibly fast. The top racers reached speeds of 85mph!! I was clocked at 81.7 MPH!!! I even watched 85-year old men and women race the downhill. I finished 2nd place in my class taking home a Silver medal. Marty was very happy as he has always wanted to race a downhill with 2 sunny training runs on Tuesday and a bright, sunny course to race on Wednesday.

The Super G was cancelled . It dumped 6" of heavy wet snow over night. Every racer and 2 groomers worked for 4 hours but were still unable to make the course safe enough to race. It was snowing at the top of the course, foggy in the middle, and raining at the bottom of the course.

Slalom was next with a very challenging course on a steep trail. The course times were running around 50 seconds on freshly fallen snow, which none of us NC boys were used too! Bobby and Marty both DQ'd and I managed to stay on my feet finishing in 3rd place and taking home the bronze medal.

The GS was last and was my favorite. The course was over a minute long and a pure rush – challenging all the way. I was picked on for having such short skis as the other racers were all on 195 cm skis with 27-30 m radius.! They set the course over a huge drop off making it a very exhilarating ride – speeds reached over 50mph. They were trying to make up for missing the Super G, but it was still the average length course for a Masters race in Vermont. Unfortunately, Bobby and Marty DQ'd the first run. I finished fourth just shy of winning a medal.

Because of my overall time and placing in the Slalom and Giant Slalom, I finished 3rd in the combined SL & GS event.

We had a great time and it was a phenomenal race – we tried to represent NC well.

2015 Ski Vacation Planning

The new BOD approved a narrowing of the field for ski vacations in 2015. With details still to be worked out, and a final selection to be made, we are considering Park City, UT and Steamboat, CO as destinations for 2015. Whichever, trip dates will be February 7-14, 2015.

We will repeat 2014's successful "Flexible Trip" to Salt Lake City, UT, with lodging at the Crystal Inn-Murray. Trips dates will be Tuesday, March 10 – Tuesday, March 17, 2015, likely with 5-, 6- and 7-night options available. Skiing will feature Brighton and Solitude in Big Cottonwood Canyon and Alta and Snowbird in Little Cottonwood Canyon.

In 2016, the current leading contender is Vail/Beaver Creek, CO. This trip was pushed from 2015 into 2016 because a World Cup ski race has already booked most of the lodging in the Beaver Creek area at the time when we wanted to go.

Bike the Virginia Creeper Trail, Wine at the Abingdon Winery, Beer & Music @ Damascus Brewery, Hike at Grayson Highlands State Park, Dine - TBD

Friday: No organized activity on Friday, but there are lots of options: Barter Theater or shopping in Abingdon, ride the Creeper Trail (to White Top?), hiking, shopping in Damascus or just relaxing while rocking on the front porch of many of the local B&B in town. Catch up with other club members as we walk to the local pizza restaurant for dinner.

Saturday: Meet at the little, red caboose in Damascus, VA

and be ready to ride at 10:00 AM on the Virginia Creeper Trail. The trail is approximately 17 miles each way. (We normally ride from Damascus to Abingdon since it is MUCH less crowded on this side of the trail on Saturday). ****Wait for the group picture before heading out****

Biking Options:

* Damascus to Abingdon: Ride up the hill and back. On the way back stop and check out the Abingdon Winery, just ½ mile from the Alvarado Station, 7 miles from Damascus. It's a great place for a picnic lunch. Sandwiches and snacks are available at the Alvarado Station.

For anyone ending the ride at the winery, please make arrangements with another participant to pick you up. No drinking and riding – be safe!

* Damascus to Whitetop (the steeper of the 2 routes): Ride up the hill and back. Or take the shuttle to the top and ride down the hill. Either way, Green Cove Station is a great place to stop and have lunch.

For shuttle reservations (highly recommended) call one of the local shuttle services. *this route is VERY crowded on Saturday*

Another local establishment you might want to check out after riding:

Damascus Brewery on Government Road, just off of Highway 58 (near the grocery store). They are open from 6-9 with live music on Saturday nights.

Saturday Dinner: Walk to the local pizza restaurant for dinner, or head to Abingdon for a night out in the city.

Sunday: Meet on the street next to the Dancing Bear B&B and be ready to leave at 10:00 AM heading to Grayson Highland State Park. If the weather is nice, there will be spectacular views and we will see the wild ponies.

RAIN JACKET & WATER REQUIRED FOR THIS HIKE. We will stop for a lunch break on the hike. The weather at Grayson Highlands can and does change dramatically and quickly – be prepared.

Sunday Dinner: We will decide as a group where we want to go for dinner and what time depending on weather, hike distance, etc.

The Crescent Ski Council's 45th annual Spring Convention brings club officials and ski industry representatives and agents together in a weekend that mixes fun with business.

Thursday night features a Welcome Party for the early arrivals. The fun starts on Friday, with Mini-Golf, Golf and Tennis tournament. The Crescent Executive Committee meets on Friday afternoon and everyone is invited to attend the Trade Show on Friday night. A DJ dance party wraps things up that evening.

On Saturday morning, the Crescent Trips meeting brings club reps and resort reps together, where they make "egg timer" presentations to the assembly. Simultaneously, the Crescent Racing Directors meet, followed by the Crescent

Race Workers' meeting with a luncheon following. Saturday, April 12 – Hike Elk Knob State Park, NC.

Meet at The Oaks shopping center in Lewisville ready to depart by 9:30 AM. Take Exit #244 off of US 421-N toward "Williams Road/Lewisville"; right at the top of the ramp and go about 0.2 mi., then left into the shopping center. We meet in the parking lot opposite Alex's Grill. Leader: Ken Lumsden. This favorite hike features excellent spring wildflowers and over 1,000 ft of gain of elevation, to the



top at 5,250 ft, on a well-graded trail with beautiful views from the top.

Sunday, April 13 – 2-4 PM.

Walk at Paul J. Ciener Botanical Garden.

This beautiful 2-acre botanical garden featuring fifteen gardens, is less than 20 minutes from Winston-Salem. The “pattern garden” features the largest spring bulb display in the Piedmont Triad—30,000 bulbs! So, put on your comfortable shoes, hat and bring your water and camera to join me in their parking lot to group-up. The visitor center and gift shop will be open for this special event and guided tours will be available. Check it out online: cienerbotanicalgarden.org. I hope to see you there! – Pat

Sunday, April 20

Hike at Profile Trail at Grandfather Mountain State Park, NC.

Meet at The Oaks (see directions, above) ready for departure at 8:30 AM. This superb hike can be moderate-to-strenuous depending on when you turn around and how much you stop along the way. Wildflowers are anticipated to be out in great profusion. If you stop to photograph them, your hike likely will be “moderate” because you will run out of time to make it past Shanty Spring (when the trail becomes rough, to the junction with the Grandfather Trail). If you’re not a wildflower-seeker and want to make it to McRae Peak, or Calloway Peak, and back, the hike becomes very strenuous. Contact Ken Lumsden ken@wssoc.org if you have questions.

Saturday, May 3

Hike Rock Castle Gorge Trail, VA.

Meet near the gas pumps at Sam’s Club on University Parkway, ready to depart by 8:00 AM. Trip Leader: Tree Bright. This is another prime wildflower hike. Trilliums and Showy Orchis may still be out and the Lily-of-the-Valley, Fire Pink and Flame Azalea should be at their peak. In recent years, we have softened this hike considerably by shuttling ourselves to the Blue Ridge Parkway, then hiking back down and around to the VA 605/Woolwine access. Saturday, June 14

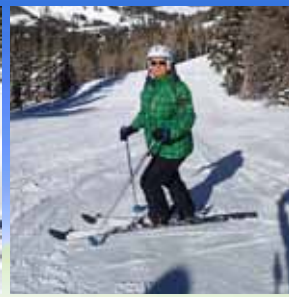
Hike to Swimming Hole on N. Harper Creek, Pisgah National Forest, NC.

Report from March 11-16, 2014 Report from W-SSOC Salt Lake City'14 "Flexible" Ski Vacation

Participants were Hal Boyle, Rick Brant & Tree Bright, Randy & Janet Leonard, Ken Lumsden, Linda Ortiz and George Wunker. W-SSOC's Kyle & Dena Carroll, who were on a private trip to Park City, skied with us on Friday at Snowbird and Kyle skied with us on Saturday, at Solitude.

This was the ultimate "flexible" ski vacation! We had eight participants traveling on 5 different flight itineraries, with 4 different lengths of stay and 5 different lift ticket combinations (1 – 6-day; 2 – 5-day; and two versions of 4-day). We skied Brighton on Wednesday, Alta on Thursday, Alta (Leonards) and Snowbird (everyone else) on Friday, Solitude (+ Kyle) on Saturday and Brighton on Sunday and Monday.

While we had nowhere near the classic "knee-deep champagne powder", we did have decent snow conditions. New snow on Monday before our arrival yielded nice tree skiing at Brighton on our first day and nice packed powder conditions Thursday-Friday. Then, a light snow, coupled with high winds, gave us variable conditions at Solitude on Saturday. On the last day, exactly as the weather forecasters predicted, heavy snow arrived at Brighton beginning at noon; by 2:30 PM, there was already over 4 inches of new snow on the ground!

We thoroughly enjoyed our accommodations at the Crystal Inn. The staff was great and the rooms spacious and well furnished. We especially enjoyed the included two meals (full buffet breakfast and light buffet dinner), as we only had to show up and eat—no reservations to be made, no decisions about where to eat and no groceries!

The public transportation worked well, too. We learned to "Tap on/Tap off", when boarding or departing the bus, using our Super Pass. For Alta/Snowbird, we caught Utah Transit Authority's bus #953 just 30 yd from the front door of the Crystal Inn and it took us to our choice of Snowbird or Alta. The Crystal Inn shuttled us about a mile to the stop for UTA bus #960 and it took us to our choice of Solitude and Brighton. Both routes have multiple return times at the end of the day. Crystal Inn also shuttled us to

and from the SLC airport and on two special excursions: to Buca di Peppo (a highly-recommended, Italian restaurant) and on another occasion, to Cold Stone Creamery.

On the last day on the way to Brighton, Ken Lumsden had an interesting "billion-to-one" coincidental experience. A group of new Crystal Inn guests boarded the shuttle and introduced themselves. Roberta Dow, who sat next to Ken said "I know a 'Lumsden'". Turns out, she once worked for Ken's uncle (Robert D. Lumsden, PhD) at the US Department of Agriculture laboratory for plant pathology in Maryland! Compounding the coincidence, Roberta's group also used our same agent, Sandy Gaudette, of SkiGroup.com!! This was an excellent trip, one that we all agreed we would do again (W-SSOC will offer the same trip in 2015!)

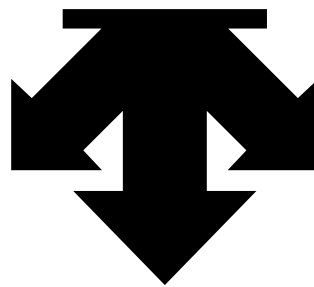
