News from 2015 Ski Vacations (and upcoming 2016...!)

At this writing, many of our skiers still have the remainder of ski season ahead of them—16 of us are headed to



Salt Lake City for a 5-night, ski 4-day trip, March 10-15, 2015. Others are headed to Big Sky, Montana, on March 23 with the Raleigh Ski & Outing Club.

Steamboat'15. Twenty-one W-SSOC skiers enjoyed spring-like conditions at Steamboat, February 7-14, 2015. It was colder at Myrtle Beach, SC early in the week! It took a while for the temps to warm up on the first day when a persistent cap of clouds parked over the slopes (and blue sky was visible all around 360 degrees on the horizon!), but by late morning, it was all blue sky and that is pretty much what we had the entire rest of the week—temperatures in the 20s overnight, warming to the upper 20s/mid-30s every day. EXCEPT for Tuesday-Powder Day! New snow ranged from 3 inches at the bottom of the mountain to over 9 inches at the top, yielding the perfect opportunity to enjoy some of the steeper slopes (e.g., Jane Conrad, Peggie High and Ken Lumsden on Rolex before it got tracked up!!). Skiing in the trees was great, too. If it had trees and great powder, Jesse Blair, Dave Corn and Dennis McNeil were sure to find it! Conditions were perfect for those with GoPro cameras. We're looking forward to seeing Rick Brant's, Dave's and Jesse's films! Among lodging we've used at Steamboat over the years, we liked The West the best for its great location with an easy walk down a paved path and across Mt Werner Circle to Gondola Square.

Upon check-in, we learned, to our dismay, that the management had bumped us from our two contracted 3BR/3B condos into 2BR+Loft/3B units. Trip Leader Tree Bright worked things out with The West, who relocated one of our parties of six to an upscale slopeside 3BR/3B condo at Torian Plum and a financial settlement was worked out for the other unit. Our 2BR/2B units were all as advertised—nicely furnished, comfortable and ideally located.

Steamboat sent a rep, Suzanne, to greet us and answer questions when we handed out lift tickets on Saturday. On Sunday, our in-resort agent's reps, Audrey and Tom

Williams, provided a lavish spread of hors d'oeuvres, beer (our club sponsor, RH Barringer's, brand—Bud and Bud Light!) and wine for our wine and cheese get-together.

On Tuesday night, we gathered again at The West's meeting room for our Pizza Party....Let's see: $1\text{-}1/2 \text{ slices/person} \times 21 \text{ persons} \times \text{pizza}/8 \text{ slices} = 4 \text{ pizzas}$. Maybe we should calculate $2 \text{ slices/person?} = 5 \text{ pizzas}$ next time for this hungry crowd? But, we had beer and wine left over!

One Wednesday, after skiing, Dick & Maira Anderson, Ken & Pat Lumsden, Patrick Parker and Vance Parker went on an excursion to the Strawberry Park Hot Springs (shuttle by Sweet Pea Tours). It has more amenities and is subdivided into more pools than we remembered from our last visit. Ken tried a version of the latest ice bath treatment used by pro athletes – he swam across the “snow-melt”-temperature pool and followed each traverse with a dip in the neighboring hot spring pool. CSC Mt Bachelor, Oregon, January 16-23, 2016. All W-SSOC members are eligible for this Crescent Ski Council trip. At this writing, Crescent has not yet determined whether the lodging will be in the town of Bend at the Hilton Hotel or at SunRiver Resort, about 15 minutes outside of town (HmMMM...reminiscent of the Racquet Club at Jackson Hole---At JH, our members preferred to be in town, or at the resort (not possible at Mt Bachelor), not in between). SunRiver reflects about \$100 pp savings. Both venues are equidistant from the skiing at Mt Bachelor. Watch for details, soon.

CSC Steamboat Race & Ski Camp, Steamboat, CO, December 5-12, 2015.

This trip is operated by the Crescent Council and on-site led by W-SSOC’s Cathie Mulgrew. You are eligible!

Crescent usually begins taking sign-ups/deposits beginning at the CSC Spring Convention (April 23-26, 2015). It continues to attract 250+ participants. W-SSOC’s participants on the 2014 version included Brad & Robyn Bilfelt, Ken & Kathy Furr, Linda Ortiz & George Wunker, Peggie High and Jane Conrad, and Cathie Mulgrew. Ask any of them and they will tell you what a great value this trip is. Peggie likes it to jump-start her regular ski season. She and Jane have been taking lessons from Instructor Gretchen – for the last 5 years in a row!

W-SSOC Beaver Creek’16, January 31-February 6, 2016. We’ve paid a deposit to secure lodging at 2015 prices at Borders Lodge (slopeside at the Elkhorn lift) and lock-in 2015 lift ticket prices. Biking Options:

* **Damascus to Abingdon:** Ride up the hill and back. On the way back stop and check out the Abingdon Winery, just ½ mile from the Alvarado Station, 7 miles from Damascus. It's a great place for a picnic lunch. Sandwiches and snacks are available at the Alvarado Station.

**** For anyone wanting to end the ride at the winery, please make arrangements with another participant to pick you up. No drinking and riding – be safe!

* **Damascus to Whitetop** (the steeper of the 2 routes): Ride up the hill and back. Or take the shuttle to the top and ride down the hill. Either way, Green Cove Station is a great place to stop and have lunch.

For shuttle reservations (highly recommended) call one of the local shuttle services. **this route is VERY crowded on Saturday

** Another local establishment you might want to check out after riding:

Damascus Brewery on Government Road, just off of Highway 58 (near the grocery store). They are open from 6-9 with live music on Saturday nights.

Saturday Dinner: again, many walk to a local restaurant for dinner, while others head to Abingdon for a night out in the big city.

Sunday: Meet on the street next to the Dancing Bear B&B and be ready to leave at 10:00 AM heading to Grayson Highland State Park. If the weather is nice, there will

Note 1. The NASTAR web site explains the "*" for Helene. It has to do with higher ranked racers who qualified at more than one resort. When this happens, NASTAR allows qualification for racers ranked lower than the otherwise threshold of 5th place in their respective Division.

Note 2. Ross, Mark and Sophie are not active on the W-SSOC Racing Team in the 2014-2015 season.

Note 3. Ross's "State or Resort" is Steamboat because he lives there. Not sure why Linda's is Steamboat unless it is the only way she qualifies?? No one else (at least no one whose name I recognize) from the CSC Steamboat'14 Ski & Race Camp is listed on the "Steamboat" list.

Note 4. Grant McAllister, Jr is not shown in the NASTAR lists of 2015 NASTAR National Qualifiers because his "Platinum" results are based on slalom races, whereas NASTAR's national rankings and invitation to the Championships, is based on Giant Slalom. Grant had platinum-level performances in GS, but it was after the deadline for the invitations. ~~Were we to netition NASTAR Grant would be invited~~

Note 5. Grant McAllister Jr's and Carol Santos' rankings are not shown in the NASTAR compilation. To find, one must look at their individual profiles. It is not easy to find the national rankings on the NASTAR web site. The link on the NASTAR web page lists the 2014 rankings, not 2015.
