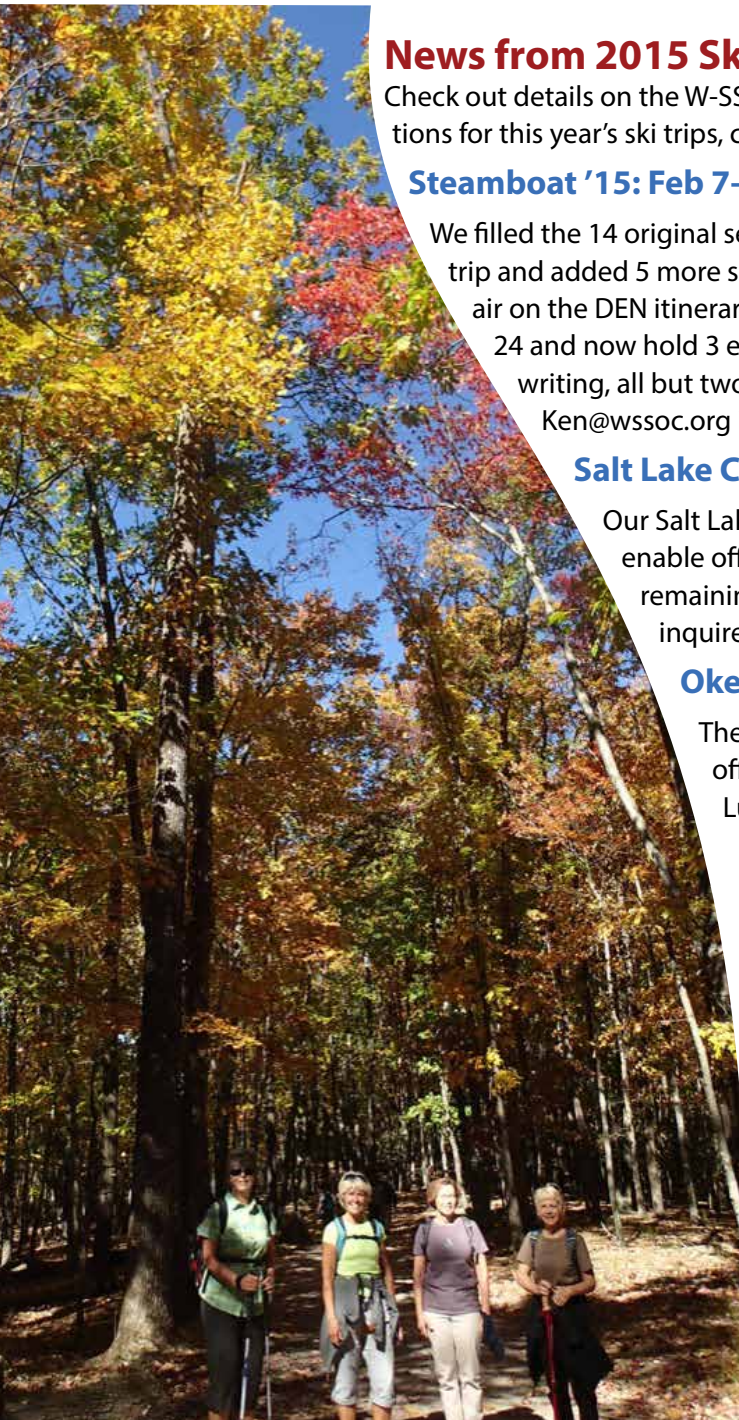
#### Okemo, VT '15: Jan 11-16, 2015

### Sunday, December 7, 2014

#### **Racing Team Training and Qualifying at Appalachian Ski Mtn, NC**

Every racer in the Crescent Ski Council's Racing Series must establish a qualifying handicap (performance-based ranking) to be eligible to race in the regular races of the Series. This race training and qualifying opportunity is the simplest way to attain "qualified" status. Furthermore, if you get qualified now, you immediately become eligible

to register to race in the regular races, also at Appalachian, on December 20 and, or 21, 2014. If you are above snow-plowing ability and can make parallel turns, it is likely that you can get qualified. Our Racing Team needs racers of all ability levels to compete in the Series races. Regardless of ability (except you must meet the minimum threshold to get "qualified"), every racer contributes to the success of the team. If you are wondering if you might like racing, or even if you might have the necessary ability to race, this is the perfect opportunity to find out. You can sign up for entry-level instruction, as well as make timed runs on the race course. Actual qualifying runs will get underway in mid-afternoon. The day gets started at 9:45 AM. We recommend that you arrive at the ski resort by 8:00 AM so you have plenty of time to get ready and to make some runs before the clinics start. ### Report from Crescent Fall'14 Conference in Gatlinburg, TN, Friday, Oct. 31-Sunday, Nov. 2

Ken Lumsden, who serves as the Chair of the Crescent Ski Council's Member Services Committee, and W-SSOC Racing Team Director, and Cathie Mulgrew, who is the

new Trip Leader-in-Training for the CSC Steamboat Race Camp, attended the conference. Wes Snyder had to withdraw at the last minute when a winter storm was forecast to strike the area. Turned out, we only got about 2 inches of measurable snow in Gatlinburg, but the nearby Mt LeConte, in the Great Smoky Mountain National Park, made the Weather Channel with 22 inches of snow. The trailhead of the Alum Cave Trail, also in GSMNP, and the trailhead for people hiking to the cabins atop Mt LeConte, got 12 inches of snow. For a few hours on Saturday afternoon, Gatlinburg was isolated in all directions due to the snow and trees falling across roads and power lines. The Gatlinburg Tram lost power late Saturday afternoon and over 200 people were stranded for a while. So, Wes was justified in his concerns, at least on Saturday. Roads, including I-40 at the TN/NC border, were all open again by Sunday morning, so we had no trouble driving home. Oh, yeah, besides the snow, we did have a conference! Ken and Cathie attended the Race Directors meeting on Saturday morning. Some minor rule revisions passed their year-after review with only slight modification. Due to the Racing meeting, Ken was unable to attend the CSC Trips Meeting, but did cast the W-SSOC votes for CSC's 2016 trips: Mt Bachelor, OR, and Big Sky, MT. Results of the vote have not yet been announced. Cathie attended the Race Workers meeting. Ken and Cathie represented W-SSOC at the CSC BOD meeting on Sunday morning where the proposal to adopt term limits for officials of the CSC administration was soundly defeated.
